Mike started swimming in Denver at the age of 11 for Englewood swim Club. He coached with Englewood Swim Club from 1970 to 1972. He coached in Sydney, Australia from 1972 to 1973, at Celebrity Swim Club from 1973 to 1976, Englewood Swim Club from 1977 to 1978. From there he went to the University of New Mexico as assistant coach 1978-1984. While at UNM he got his MA in Exercise Science. He started the Lobo Aquatic Club in 1978 while at UNM. He was Head Coach of the University of Wyoming from 1984 to 1988.

Coach Doane started coaching with Colorado Springs Swim Team as head coach in 1988. Under Mike's coaching expertise, CSST has become one of the dominant teams in the region as well as nationally. Mike brings 33 years of coaching experience to CSST, including 10 years of collegiate experience.
