



Pam Rogers

1973 - moved from Florida to Littleton and joined the Tarpons! "I was devastated to leave where I grew up, and if I hadn't had that group of new swimming friends, I would likely have begged my parents to let me move back to FL by myself."

1973-75 - HS All American (Heritage High School), **100 Breast National HS Record**. Began swimming year round for the first time, with Celebrity Swim Club (Mike Doane & Jim Railey)

1975-1976 - US Team, Israel. Hapoel Games 1st Place 100 M Breast
US Team, Czechoslovakia 3rd

1976 - 4th at US Olympic Trials (missed team by .01 sec) 1976-- World Ranked

1975-76 - Colorado Sportswoman of the Year Award - Best HS Swimmer

1977 - World University Games Team (did not compete due to injury)

1975-79 - 16x ASU AIAW (later NCAA) All American, 4 years
Best individual finishes, 2nd - 50 Breast, 2nd - 100 Breast
Relay - 1st 400 Med Relay

1980 - Olympic Trials Qualifier, 100 M Breast (chose not to compete, even after I trained for a year, due to US boycott of games) (I believe I was ranked 4th in the US prior to the Trials, but I can't quite find that info since I decided not to attend)

1983 - 1990s-- National level triathlete, both amateur and professional

Masters

* 1988 - World and US Masters 1st place time 50 and 100 BR SCM

* 1990 - Masters World Record 50 M Breaststroke (30-34)

* 1991 - 2nd in 50 and 100 LCM Breast at World championships, Brisbane, Austra

1991 - City of Flagstaff and Mayor designate April 26 as "Pam Rogers Day" for contributions to athletics, coaching, and community service (Hospice, Victim Witness Service, and Special Olympics Aquatics
2007-- Inducted into the Northern Arizona University Hall of Fame
